Lake Placid, Adirondack Mountains, & Vermont

Day 1: Saturday, September 26

Our excellent adventure starts today as we make our way to Rochester, NY. After checking in we will head to dinner at **Artisan Works**, a renovated factory space with an eclectic collection of art. (D)

Day 2: Sunday, September 27

After breakfast we are headed to Lake Placid and the Cloudsplitter Gondola on Whiteface Mountain. A fifteen minute ride gliding through the air in the awe-inspiring natural beauty of the Adirondack Mountain range, the Cloudsplitter Gondola Ride transports visitors from the base of Whiteface Mountain to the peak of Little Whiteface. Look around and you'll find yourself surrounded by Lake Placid, Lake Placid Village, Lake Champlain and some of the most massive peaks in all of New York State. We'll check in to our hotel for the next 5 nights in Lake Placid. Dinner is included tonight at the hotel. (B,D)

Day 3: Monday, September 28

We will be taking a scenic drive up the Veterans Memorial Hwy to the peak of Whiteface Mountain for stunning views of the region. This will be followed by a guided tour of the Olympic Center. Walk through the Olympic Center and you'll see hallways adorned with plaques and banners toting the achievements of past Olympians. In the Olympic Center and on its grounds are skating rinks, open to the public, where gold medals have been won – including the famous Herb Brooks Arena where the "Miracle On Ice" game was played and the speed skating Oval where many Olympic and other international speed skating competitions have been held. We will also tour the Olympic jumping facility today. Ski jumping showcases, competitions, and athlete training is at the core of the Olympic Jumping Complex. Take the Scenic Elevator to the sky deck of the 128 meter ski jump. With its glass exterior, the ride-up gives a stunning bird's-eye view of the Adirondack High Peaks. The sky deck offers 360-degree panoramic views of Lake Placid— the kind that would usually require an hour-long hike up a mountain—all accessible in just a 30-second elevator ride. (B)

Day 4: Tuesday, September 29

We head to Essex, NY, to board our Ferry that will take us across Lake Champlain into Vermont. This is the southernmost crossing on Lake Champlain. It is a beautiful 30-minute boat ride that offers a perfect vantage point for fall foliage. Just a 15 minute ride up the road is the Vermont Teddy Bear Factory, where we'll tour their production facility. When we are finished here, we will head over to the Shelburne Museum. The Museum's 45-acre campus is comprised of 39 buildings, 25 of which are historic and were relocated to the Museum. Among the most beloved attractions on the campus are the Shaker Design Round Barn, General Store, carousel, and the 220-foot sidewheel steamboat Ticonderoga. Visitors enjoy strolling the beautifully landscaped grounds with 22 gardens. Next up will be the Spirit of Ethan Allen Dinner Cruise. You'll enjoy this cruise on beautiful Lake Champlain, nestled in the heart of Burlington, Vermont. They are the only cruise ship located on Lake Champlain, which offers breathtaking views of the city, the Green Mountains of Vermont, and the New York Adirondacks. (B,D)

Day 5: Wednesday, September 30

This morning's adventure takes us to The Adirondack Experience-the Museum on Blue Mountain Lake. The Museum on Blue Mountain Lake is open for its 68th season, offering the most immersive and diverse visitor experience in its six decades. Perched on 121 sprawling acres overlooking stunning Blue Mountain Lake, the Adirondack Experience tells the compelling story of the region's past, present and future. Explore their 24 galleries and historic buildings, meet boat builders and basket makers. We'll follow this up with a lunch cruise on Raquette Lake. Our cruise on Raquette Lake includes breath-taking scenery, fascinating history and delicious food that combine to create an experience you won't soon forget. (B,L)

Day 6: Thursday, October 1

We venture south to Fort Ticonderoga. Welcoming visitors since 1909, Fort Ticonderoga preserves 2,000 acres of historic landscape on Lake Champlain, and Carillon Battlefield, and the largest series of untouched Revolutionary War era earthworks surviving in America. As a destination and the premier place to learn more about our nation's earliest years and America's military heritage, Fort Ticonderoga is a historic destination with many attractions. A box lunch is also included. Just a few miles down the road from here is the Star Trek Museum. When the STAR TREK television series was canceled in 1969, the original sets were dismantled and largely destroyed, only a few items of the actual sets remain today, and those that have survived are in private collections. Trek superfan James Cawley began the process of rebuilding the sets just as they would have been seen 55 years ago when the series was being filmed. A 14 year journey has culminated in the most accurate rebuild of the original sets is now open, welcoming STAR TREK fans from all over the world! (B,L)

Day 7: Friday, October 2

This morning we depart the Grand Adirondack Hotel and Lake Placid and make our way to **Buffalo**, **NY** and the **Buffalo Marriott Hotel**. A **wonderful dinner** is included this evening as we gather, relax, and talk about the events and spectacular scenery of the previous week. (B,D)
